

ACTIVE SHOOTER & INTRUDER RESPONSE TRAINING (ASIR)



4-Hour Active Shooter and Intruder Response Training for Schools

This course bridges the gap between responding law enforcement officers and school staff, administrators, and other personnel in school active shooter situation.

The 4-hour half-day sessions include:

The training assists school staff in their ability to prevent, report and protect themselves and their students from an active shooter during the critical moments they are waiting for police to arrive. It also educates school staff about what to expect from officers once they are on site.

- An overview and historic examination of school shootings and lessons learned for schools and law enforcement.
- An in-depth analysis of lockdown procedures from threats inside and outside the building.
- What to do if lockdown fails.
- The 3 Outs Response Model: Lock Out, Get Out, Take Out
- How to secure multiple types of doors, including locking, layering, and reinforcing
- Access Control & Visitor Management

The four-hour session will be divided into classroom instruction and practical, hands-on scenarios to put the lessons into action. Law enforcement and school personnel will participate in the active scenarios to make it a more meaningful experience. This will include a walk-through of the school to demonstrate safety and security principles in various locations and conditions.
